Friday May 1st, 2020 – Coronavirus Update **Please note anything highlighted in yellow is new information**

Goal 1: Keep employees healthy and safe

- A. Total Number of PPE and Test Supply Available Per Site:
 - i. Dental-Sedalia:
 - 1. 11 day supply of PPE
 - ii. Dental-Warsaw:
 - 1. 1 day supply of PPE – Received 300 N95 masks today!
 - iii. Marshall:
 - 1. 49 day supply of PPE
 - 2. Quest Test: 4
 - 3. LabCorp Test: 8
 - 4. GeneTrait Kits: 8
 - iv. Sedalia:
 - 1. 23 day supply of PPE
 - 2. Quest Test: 12
 - 3. LabCorp Test: 17
 - 4. GeneTrait Kits: 131
 - v. Versailles:
 - 1. 34 day supply of PPE
 - 2. Quest Test: 12
 - 3. LabCorp Test: 3
 - 4. GeneTrait Test: 21
 - vi. Warsaw:
 - 1. 57 day supply of PPE – Gowns will be shared with Sedalia
 - 2. Quest Test: 4
 - 3. LabCorp Test: 9
 - 4. GeneTrait Kits: 38
- B. Each morning when you enter the building sign and date the Daily Screening Log and document your temperature and current symptoms if you have any.
 - a. Please report a temperature of 100.4 or greater to your site manager.

Goal 2: Keep possible COVID-19 patients from spreading illness to the community

- A. When calling patients regarding negative COVID-19 test results. Please address if there symptoms are getting better, the same, or worsening. If patient states there symptoms are the same or getting worse please notify the provider and an appointment may be needed.

- a. COVID-19 test sensitivity is not 100%. It is important to address their symptoms and determine if further action is needed.

Goal 3: Continue to provide high quality of care to our patients and our communities patients by using science to guide prevention, testing, and treatment

- A. Number of patients seen today during the community testing hours:
 - a. Marshal: 1 individuals tested
 - b. Sedalia: 14 individuals tested
 - c. Versailles: 4 individuals tested
 - d. Warsaw: 2 individuals tested
- B. COVID-19 testing criteria has been lifted. Katy Trail will test anyone who needs to be tested.
- C. Process maps have been created for the following, please take time to review:
 - a. Scheduling COVID-19 Testing – This includes scheduling and when the patient arrives to the clinic
 - b. Notification of COVID-19 Positive Result During Business Hours
 - c. Notification of COVID-19 Positive Result After Hours & Weekends

Goal 4: Contribute to the community efforts to address the crisis

- A. Handing out food boxes to Katy Trail patients that we test for COVID-19 and are quarantined
- B. Participating daily in the Incident Command Meeting

Goal 5: Assure our financial security in order to sustain our services

- A. Small Business Loan – Katy Trail has been approved.
- B. Applied for the FCC telehealth grant
- C. Received CARES Emergency funds
- D. KTCH is billing for both telehealth and telephone visits

Goal 6: Plan for the new future of KTCH

- A. Continuing with EHR implementation. Expected go-live date with ECW will be October 1st.
- B. Population Health approach to virtual visits – Working on a process.
 - a. Currently, case managers are reaching out to high-risk patients that need a follow up appointment and to ensure they have the resources they need. Also, there are two active PDSA's that were put into place. One PDSA is reaching out to patients that are due for a colon cancer screening. Staff are delivering a goodie bag that contains a roll of toilet paper and a FIT Test. What better time to capture these patients while they are in the comfort of their home! The second PDSA is reaching out to our uncontrolled hypertension patients. For those that have uncontrolled hypertension and need to be monitored more closely, staff are delivering blood pressure cuffs to their home.

Oral Health Update from Dr. Vandevender and Mendy:

To our providers:

- A. If you are interesting in wearing scrubs for while working in the clinic, please email Dr. Turner with the needed size.
- B. Dr. Turner will be reviewing provider schedules daily. If needed the on-call provider schedule will be opened to allow for more patient capacity.
- C. All providers will see 4 new patients per day.
- D. Researching the use of cloth gowns. This may be an option to preserve PPE supplies.
- E. In order for healthcare workers to return to work after a positive COVID test. The state requires them to have 2 negative test that are 24 hours apart.

Standing Items:

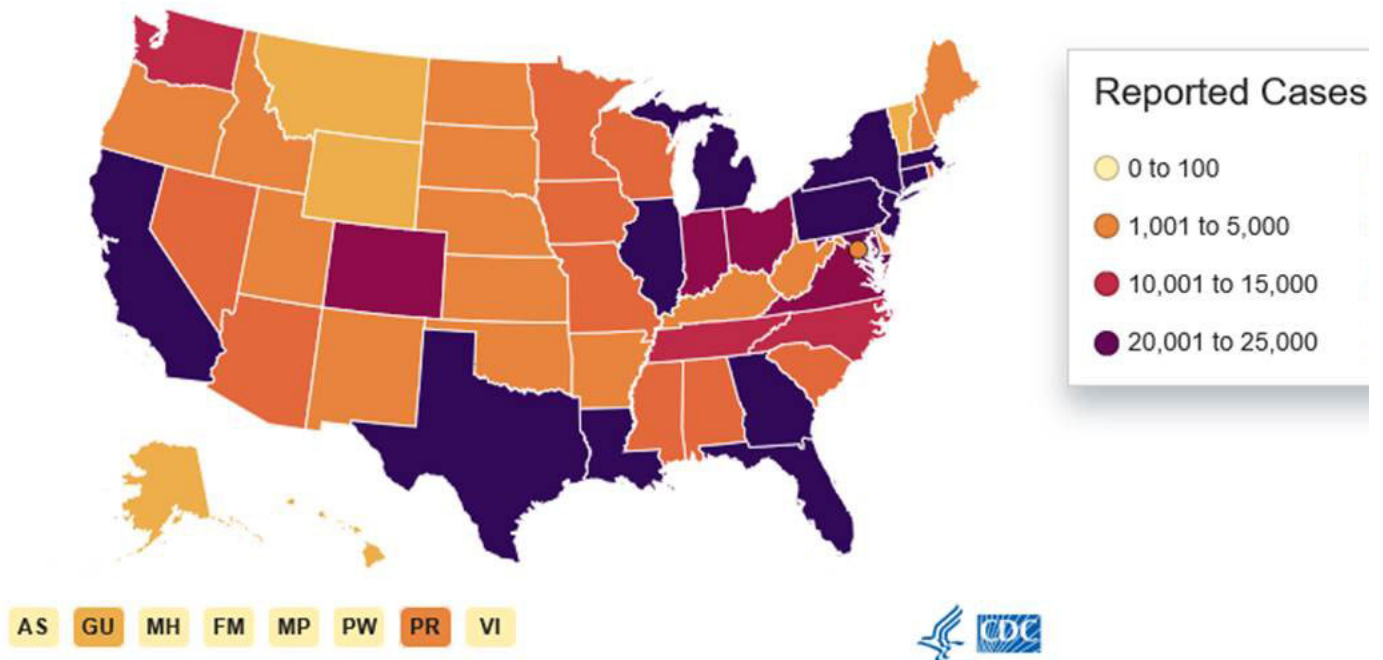
1. Cases Reported in U.S.

- a. As of today, there has been a total of 1,062,446 COVID-19 cases in the United States. Please see map below of states reporting COVID-19 cases.

2. In Missouri:

- a. 7,835 positive COVID-19 cases
 - i. Benton County – 8 positive case
 - ii. Morgan County – 4 positive case
 - iii. Pettis County – 36 positive case
 - iv. Saline County – 190 positive case

20 states report more than 10,000 cases of COVID-19.
