Wednesday April 22nd, 2020 – Coronavirus Update **Please note anything highlighted in yellow is new information**

Goal 1: Keep employees healthy and safe

A. Total Number of PPE and Test Supply Available Per Site:

- i. Dental-Sedalia:
 1. 4 day supply of PPE
 2. Item Needed: N95 mask
- ii. Dental-Warsaw:
 1. 1 day supply of PPE
 2. Item Needed: Gowns, N95, Face Shields, Gloves
- iii. Marshall:
 1. 25 day supply of PPE
 2. Quest Test: 2
 3. LabCorp Test: 6
 4. GeneTrait Test: 60
 5. Item Needed: N95 mask
- iv. Sedalia:
 1. 36 day supply of PPE
 2. Quest Test: 12
 3. LabCorp Test: 17
 4. GeneTrait Test: 176
 5. Lowest Item: Gowns
- v. Versailles:
 1. 34 day supply of PPE
 2. Quest Test: 20
 3. LabCorp Test: 3
 4. GeneTrait Test: 101
 5. Lowest Item: N95 mask
- vi. Warsaw:
 1. 47 day supply of PPE
 2. Quest Test: 4
 3. LabCorp Test: 9
 4. GeneTrait Test: 54
 5. Lowest Item: Shoe Covers

Goal 2: Keep possible COVID-19 patients from spreading illness to the community

- A. When calling patients regarding negative COVID-19 test results. Please address if there symptoms are getting better, the same, or worsening. If patient states there symptoms are the same or getting worse please notify the provider and an appointment may be needed.

- a. COVID-19 test sensitivity is not 100%. It is important to address their symptoms and determine if further action is needed.

Goal 3: Continue to provide high quality of care to our patients and our communities patients by using science to guide prevention, testing, and treatment

- A. Number of patients seen today during the community testing hours:
 - a. Marshal: Community Testing Not Open
 - b. Sedalia: 5 individuals tested
 - c. Versailles: 1 individuals tested
 - d. Warsaw: Community Testing Not Open

Goal 4: Contribute to the community efforts to address the crisis

- A. Handing out food boxes to Katy Trail patients that we test for COVID-19 and are quarantined
- B. Reaching out to food pantries in other counties and seeing how we can assist them
- C. Participating daily in the Incident Command Meeting

Goal 5: Assure our financial security in order to sustain our services

- A. Small Business Loan – Katy Trail has been approved.

Oral Health Update from Dr. Vandevender and Mendy:

- A. The MDA issued the following statement regarding anyone needing to renew their CPR/BLS certifications:
 - a. *Additionally, the Board is waiving restrictions prohibiting online-only certification in Basic Life Support. This will allow licensees to obtain certification or recertification in BLS using online-only certification courses. This waiver will apply for the 2020 renewal period only or for applications received during the current state of emergency. For any questions, contact the Missouri Dental Board.*
- B. The American Heart Association has stated that they will extend the recommended renewal dates out 120 past those times.
- C. Please remember if you are coming into the clinic to please enter the south end door in the back of the clinic.
 - a. Mendy or Miranda will take your temperature before you go into the clinic. If you come in at noon or any time after 7:30am, please call Mendy or Miranda to come and take your temperature.
- D. During emergency dental treatment, shoe covers should be worn. Shoes should still be left at work, but we are adding the extra layer of protection to keep from potentially spreading anything throughout the clinic.

To our providers:

- A. Within the next week or two, Zoom visits will be held every Tuesday and Friday. On Wednesday and Thursday's Dr. Turner will provide an update via email.
- B. Exploring options to complete Well-Child visits, especially for ages 2 years and under.
- C. Dr. Turner is researching FDA approved antibody COVID test.
- D. Zoom Visits:
 - a. Obtain verbal consent
 - b. Ensure patients privacy – Let them know that it is just you and the patient on the virtual visit
 - c. Choose a neutral background
 - d. In case of disconnection, obtain the patients telephone number

e. Will be implementing Zoom Etiquette for patients and expectations

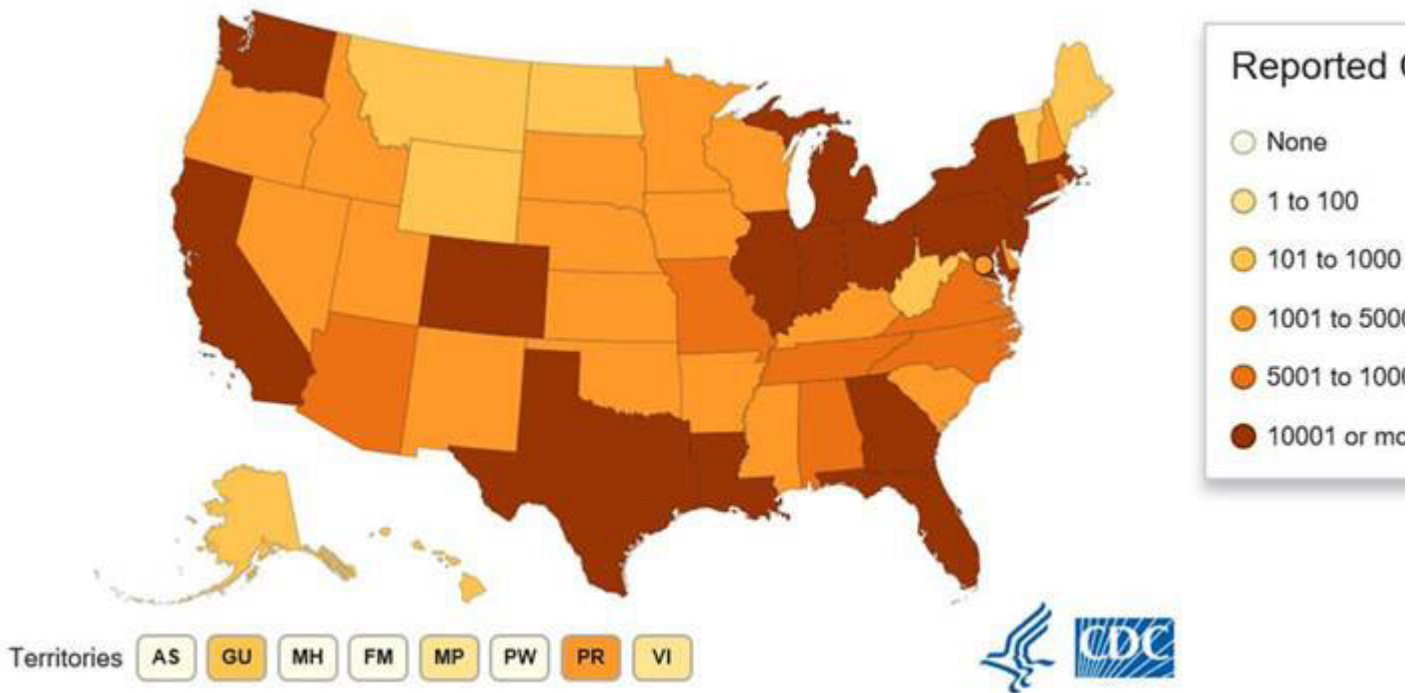
Standing Items:

1. Cases Reported in U.S.

a. As of today, there has been a total of 802,583 COVID-19 cases in the United States. Please see map below of states reporting COVID-19 cases.

2. In Missouri:

- a. 6,137 positive COVID-19 cases
 - i. Benton County – 3 positive case
 - ii. Morgan County – 3 positive case
 - iii. Pettis County – 16 positive case
 - iv. Saline County – 106 positive case
